



KING EDWARD VI SCHOOL TRIPS - PARENTAL CONSENT

PARENTAL AGREEMENT

1. I consent to my son/daughter taking part in the activities set out in the information letter. He/She is in good health and I consider him/her to be capable of taking part.
2. In the event of illness or accident whilst away, I consent to any medical treatment, which might include the use of anaesthetics.
3. I consent to my son/daughter having appropriate indirect supervision during the planned visits, for example in groups of four to go shopping.
4. I am aware that the school regulations apply whenever a student is on an activity and that, accordingly, no student may participate in an activity with the School unless he or she is a current member of the School. I am aware that the contract signed when joining the school is applicable on any school related venture and any student who disobeys School Regulations or behaves in a reckless manner may lose privileges on the trip (e.g., loss of a day participating in an activity). Continued misbehaviour may result in the student being sent home and parents would incur the full costs of this action; these costs may include staff travel and replacement costs. In addition, if needed, a School based sanction may also be used following the trip, such as an after-school detention, a Saturday detention or exclusion as deemed appropriate by the school. In the most serious of instances the school may also decide that a student is not permitted to take a place on subsequent residential trips.
5. I will inform the School of any changes to my child's medical condition or individual needs, agreement to medical treatment and any changes to emergency contact numbers.

Please notify the trip leader if there is any further information concerning your son's/daughter's participation in the activity which you feel the school should be aware of.

The School is insured in respect of claims for which it may become legally liable arising from normal School activities. The School's full travel insurance details are available on request; please contact the organising member of staff in the first instance. Parents may wish to make their own arrangements if they feel that additional insurance is necessary.
